

**5-2-1 DRAINAGE AUTHORITY
RESOLUTION NO. 2008-07**

**A RESOLUTION ADOPTING A FEE SCHEDULE for a
5-2-1 DRAINAGE AUTHORITY STORMWATER CONSTRUCTION PERMIT**

WHEREAS, Intergovernmental Agreements have been executed between the 5-2-1 Drainage Authority and the City of Grand Junction, the Town of Palisade, the City of Fruita, Mesa County, and the Grand Valley Drainage District, collectively known as Contracting Parties, wherein the 5-2-1 Drainage Authority is required to provide various services to the Contracting Parties, and,

WHEREAS, under these Intergovernmental Agreements, some of the services to be performed by the 5-2-1 Drainage Authority on behalf of the Contracting Parties include the review of Construction Stormwater Management Plans, subsequent issuance of Stormwater Construction Permits, and field inspection activities associated with said Permit, and,

WHEREAS, it is a general policy of the Board of the 5-2-1 Drainage Authority that Applicants for Stormwater Construction Permits who will receive review, permitting, and inspection services from Authority personnel, should pay a fee to the Authority to offset the costs of providing those services, and,

WHEREAS, the Authority has performed an analysis to identify the costs associated with performing said services, and has established a fee schedule proportional to the estimated costs of services, and

WHEREAS, in consideration of the financial participation of the five Contracting Parties in the formation and operation of the Authority, it is appropriate to waive the fees that would normally be applicable to a Contracting Party under this Resolution.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE BOARD OF 5-2-1 DRAINAGE AUTHORITY, A POLITICAL SUBDIVISION OF THE STATE OF COLORADO THAT:


1. The Stormwater Construction Permit Fee Schedule attached hereto as Exhibit A is hereby adopted, with an effective date of January 01, 2009.
2. All Fees shall be assessed only for projects within the legal jurisdiction of the 5-2-1 Drainage Authority, and for which services are performed by the Authority.
3. When the original Applicant for a Stormwater Construction Permit is one of the Contracting Parties, all associated Stormwater Construction Permit Fees shall be waived.
4. Subsequent revisions to the Fees identified in Exhibit A may occur annually as part

of an annual Fee Resolution passed and adopted by the Board of Directors.

5. The Authority Manager is directed to prepare implementing policies and procedures consistent with this Resolution.

EXHIBIT A

5-2-1 Drainage Authority Stormwater Construction Permit Fee Schedule

Adopted : December 17, 2008

Effective Date: January 1, 2009

All Projects receiving Construction Stormwater Management Plan review services, and all projects obtaining a Stormwater Construction Permit issued by the 5-2-1 Drainage Authority, shall pay review and permitting/inspection fees based upon disturbed land area calculated to the nearest 0.1 acre, according to the following schedule:

Disturbed Land Area ⁽¹⁾	Review FEE	Permitting/ Inspection FEE
1 - 7.9 Acres ⁽²⁾	\$250.00	\$250.00
8.0 acres to 19.9 Acres ⁽³⁾	\$400.00	\$500.00
20 Acres and above ⁽⁴⁾	\$800.00	\$900.00

Additional Inspections ⁽⁵⁾	FEE
Screening Inspection	\$0.00
Field Inspection w/ followup (under 20 acres)	\$150.00
Field Inspection w/ followup (20 acres and over)	\$200.00
Full Audit (under 20 acres)	\$275.00
Full Audit (20 acres and over)	\$325.00

- (1) Disturbed Land Area includes all areas of cut, fill, stockpile, staging, equipment and material storage, or any other project area associated with Construction Activity, as defined by State of Colorado stormwater regulations. No reductions are given for public land dedications such as streets and open space. Undisturbed land areas may be omitted from the calculation if they are specifically identified in the Construction Stormwater Management Plan as remaining in undisturbed natural conditions, and controls are specified in the Plan to ensure the area remains undisturbed during construction.
- (2) The scope of services includes file and project administration, one screening inspection, one field inspection or full audit, one followup (screening) inspection, and one closeout inspection.
- (3) The scope of services includes file and project administration, one screening inspection, two field inspections or full audits, two followup (screening) inspections, and one closeout inspection.
- (4) The scope of services includes file and project administration, one screening inspection, two field inspections, one full audit, three followup (screening) inspections, and one closeout inspection.
- (5) All inspections above and beyond the scope of services listed above for each category shall be charged at the specified rate, and paid to the Authority prior to receiving final closeout notification.
